## Paula Newsletter - June 2010

Dear Supporter

We are heading off tonight for our journey to Mozambique. There are 16 of us (12 Russians, 2 Brits, 1 Dutch and 1 American) and we are heading to Pemba where we will be staff and students of Heidi Bakers Mission's School. We will travel two days by train to Moscow, then fly to South Africa and then travel about 4 days by bus to Pemba. It is very exciting to be taking such a big team, some of the Russians have never been outside of Russia before, and others are team members who we have been training for a while. I believe that, as always, it will be life changing for all involved.

We have had an interesting few months. The seminar that we did in the Middle East went really well, with lots of physical and emotional healings. Two ladies in their 70s and 80s had their backs healed and were dancing and touching their toes for the first time in years. Another grandmother's chest was healed and the next day she walked so fast that her grandchildren were surprised when they couldn't keep up with her any more. One young woman, who was delivered from oppression, when she came through her front door jumping for joy, her non-Christian husband looked at her and told her to bring their 5 children to us for us to pray over them too! By the end of the seminar there was lots of joy and radiant faces! God did a lot of healing in the life of the pastor and his family; after being set free from fear, he was able to play the guitar in public and lead the worship for the first time. They had been without a worship leader for a while since the last one had left.

After that we ended up spending a month in the UK. Firstly it took a couple of weeks to get a new visa, and then the volcano in Iceland decided to erupt and we got stuck in England for 3 weeks before BA was able to get us a new flight. The Lord used the time however in an amazing way. I had a lovely birthday party there, and had a good opportunity to catch up with friends and to rest. In the past few months God had been showing us new ways of doing church. Then because of being in the UK longer than planned we got to see an old friend, Tony Dale, who was speaking at KC21, sharing about the very thing God has been talking to us about: simple churches. Then we were able to go to a seminar in Nottingham with people from all over the UK who are exploring new ways of doing church. It was such an encouragement and a breathe of fresh air for us. The Lord also gave me the opportunity to meet with people who have been supporting us in the UK and discuss the way forward.

Being away from Russia for nearly 5 months meant that it was also a really good time for the team in Russia, they had to run the Centre without me while they waited for us to come back. When we got back, it was so exciting to see that the Centre was running so smoothly without me and the atmosphere was better than it had ever been. God is good! The 3 weeks we have spent here have flown past.

It was lovely to see my children again; they are now all very grown up. Nastya is now living in Mahachkala, helping to look after her father who is not very well and has a job looking after children. She is doing a lot better than she was. We are praying about her future in the autumn, whether she needs to continue her education and if so, where. Lera is hoping to go the USA for the summer after she has finished her exams at university. Please pray for doors to be opened for her and for a safe and fun trip. Anya is still living with her boyfriend; her boyfriend is very controlling and won't let her out much, but he did let her come and see us once. We went to see Ali yesterday for his last day of school and he has become thin and quite tall. He was thrilled to see us and with the new phone he got as a present. He has two years left in the orphanage before he is allowed out.
